TERO Began Offering Individualized Training

- •Started with OSHA 10/30 in Construction, HAZWOPER, and Traffic Control Training in 2019
- •Since 2019, additional training has been offered to keep up with the needs of the worker requests, contractors, and grant promises.
- •Some training was free through the United Steelworkers Tony Mazzocchi Center (USWTMC).
- •Team Oregon Build Partnership

Applied Marathon Grant 2022

- Welding Simulator
- Used for Pre-Apprenticeship Training
- Students began

Applied for Ready for Oregon Grant 2023/2024

- •7-Week Pre-Apprenticeship Program
- •162 Total Hours -> 6 HRS/Day -> 4 Days/WK
- •32 started, 28 graduated




Overview

TERO started to offer individualized training but wanted to provide more in-depth training that outside entities would recognize on the TERO projects, in addition to having a recognized certification to help workers choose a career for a long duration to come out with the long-term benefits, instead of the norm of careers ending in construction with no benefits to show for the hard work that had been put in for years.

Applying for grant funding has been very beneficial in aiding the training successes. The plan is to continue to build upon what we have, use what we have found works, and mold it as we go! 
